Circular to the Members of the 49th Synod

Re: 1st Session of the 49th Synod

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Robert Wicks, the Diocesan Secretary, is pleased to answer any questions about this session of the Synod.

Please bring this with you for use at Synod.

This circular has information that members of Synod need to know. Paragraphs 2.12 (notices of motions for the session), 3.3 (closing time for nominations) and 3.8 (closing time for delivering a précis for a nominee in an election) refer to deadlines to be observed.

1. Archbishop's summons to Synod

Summons to the 1st Session of the 49th Synod

Under the Article 1(2) of the Schedule to the Anglican Church of Australia Constitutions Act 1902, I invite you to the Synod to be held in the Wesley Theatre, 220 Pitt Street, Sydney commencing at 3.15 pm on Monday 10 October 2011.

Details about the opening service will be circulated in the next mailing to Synod members.

2. Arrangements and likely business

Meeting Places and Dates

2.1 The days of meeting are Monday 10, Tuesday 11, Wednesday 12, Monday 17, Tuesday 18 October 2011 at the Wesley Theatre, 220 Pitt Street Sydney. The proposed meeting times are as follows –

For the first day -

3.15 pm to 5.30 pm

5.30 pm to 7.00 pm - Meal Break

7.00 pm to 9.30 pm

For the second and subsequent days -

3.15 pm to 5.45 pm

5.45 pm to 7.00 pm - Meal Break

7.00 pm to 9.30 pm

Synod mailings and other communications

2.2 There will be 2 or, possibly, 3 mailings for this session –

(a) This mailing is the 1st mailing.

(b) A 2nd mailing will be sent on or about 2 September 2011 if a postal ballot is required to be held before the session for certain positions on the Standing Committee (see item 4.7). That mailing will contain relevant ballot papers and precis information.

(c) A 3rd mailing (or 2nd mailing if the postal ballot referred to in (b) is not required) will be sent on or about 22 September 2011 and will contain the Standing Committee's Report, the draft legislation and principal ordinances, other reports, the Notice of Contested Elections and the Business Paper for 10 October 2011.

2.3 From time to time less formal communications are sent to Synod members. These communications are greatly assisted if members ensure that the Registry has your current email address. Updated email addresses can be sent to the Registry at registry@sydney.anglican.asn.au.

Declarations by lay members - certificates of election

2.4 Before taking part in debate or voting on any matter at the 49th Synod all lay members are to sign a declaration that they are communicant members of the Anglican Church of Australia and not members of any other church.

2.5 Lay representatives of parochial units must give notice of their election to the Registrar in accordance with clause 17 of the Synod Membership Ordinance 1995 before the declaration is made. Alternates for parochial representatives must give notice of their appointment to the Registrar in accordance with clause 22A(2) of that Ordinance before the declaration is made.

2.6 Members may make the declaration at the reception desk at St Andrew's House during office hours, or in the Wesley Theatre during the session. Lay representatives of parochial units are reminded to produce their Election Notification form when signing the declaration. This form can be downloaded from the Registry's website www.sydneyanglicanregistry.com.au/index.php/p2/synod.

Synod procedures, constituting Acts and principal ordinances

2.7 Useful information about the Synod can be accessed on the Secretariat's website at www.sds.asn.au under For Synod & Standing Committee. This includes, for example, the rules by which members may table reports and circulate printed material in relation to elections or other matters relating to the business of Synod.

2.8 You can read a summary of the proceedings of the 2010 Synod session on the Secretariat's website at www.sds.asn.au under For Synod & Standing Committee then Synod in Past Years.

2.9 The Acts of Parliament by which the Anglican Church is constituted in New South Wales and the latest version of the principal ordinances of the Synod can be accessed on the Secretariat's website at www.sds.asn.au under For Synod & Standing Committee then Acts & Ordinances.

- 2.10 By resolution 19/07, the Synod requested that the “Synod Survival Guide, 4th Edition” prepared by Mr Robert Tong be provided to newly elected members. Mr Tong’s booklet is available from the Diocesan Secretary on request or can be downloaded from <http://acl.asn.au/guide/index.html>.

Membership of the Synod

- 2.11 A list of members will be tabled in the Synod on 10 October 2011.

Notices of motions for the Session

- 2.12 Notices of motions to be included on the business paper for the first day of the session are to be in writing and be received by the Standing Committee (address letters to the Diocesan Secretary) **by 10 September 2011**. A member of Synod may give up to 2 notices of motions in this manner.
- 2.13 Any member of Synod may give notice of a further motion or motions at the start of business on the first 3 days of the session.

Guidelines for the moving of motions

- 2.14 Part 4 of the business rules (being the rules set out in the Schedule to the Conduct of the Business of Synod Ordinance 2000) contain the general rules of debate in the Synod. The various stages for the consideration of ordinances and rules are described on the Secretariat’s website at www.sds.asn.au under For Synod & Standing Committee then Administration – [Synod Procedures](#). Most business is transacted through motions and amendments.
- 2.15 The subject matter of a motion must relate to the order and good government of the Church within this Diocese, or the declaration of views on matters affecting the Anglican Church of Australia or affecting the spiritual, moral or social welfare of this Church, otherwise it may be out of order.
- 2.16 A notice of a motion should be brief and to the point, it should not contain argument, it should not have a long preamble or be written as a speech, and it should not contain material which is unbecoming or defamatory.
- 2.17 If in doubt about the form of a motion, try and find a precedent from the resolutions of the previous session (see the Secretariat’s website at www.sds.asn.au under For Synod & Standing Committee then Synod in Past Years) or ask the Diocesan Secretary or someone else who has experience of the business of Synod. These things need thoughtful preparation, so do not leave it until the last minute.

Reports and Ordinances for the Session

- 2.18 Reports and audited accounts from approximately 60 committees etc will be tabled and are available to be viewed by Synod members during the session.
- 2.19 Proposed ordinances include –
- Archbishop of Sydney (Solemn Promises) Amendment Ordinance 2011
 - Authorised Services Ordinance 2011
 - General Synod – Constitution Amendment (Chapter V) Canon 2010 Assenting Ordinance 2011)
 - General Synod – Special Tribunal Canon 2007 Amendment (No 2) Canon 2010 Adopting Ordinance 2011
 - Parochial Cost Recoveries Ordinance 2009 Amendment Ordinance 2011
 - Relinquishment of Holy Orders (Exclusion and Reinstatement) Ordinance 2011
 - Solemn Promises Ordinance 2011
- 2.20 Detailed information about proposed ordinances will be provided in the mailing to be sent on or about 22 September 2011.

3. Notice of elections for this Synod Session

Elections to be conducted

- 3.1 The elections for offices to be conducted before or during the 1st session of the 49th Synod in October this year are set out in the Schedule of Elections Required (see item 6).
- 3.2 In the Schedule of Elections Required –
- (a) the relevant organisations are listed in alphabetical order, and the names of retiring members are shown with their attendances at meetings during the year to 30 June 2011, and
 - (b) an asterisk (*) beside the name of a retiring member means that there is good reason to believe the member is willing to be nominated.

Invitation to make Nominations

- 3.3 Members are invited to make nominations of persons for each of the elections to be conducted. The closing time for the making of nominations is **5.00 pm on Monday 29 August 2011**.
- 3.4 Under rule 3.2(2) of the Schedule to the Synod Elections Ordinance 2000, a nomination is –
- (a) to be in writing, and
 - (b) to specify the office for which the nomination is being made, and
 - (c) to specify the name, address and occupation of the nominee, and
 - (d) to specify the details of the qualification held by the nominee, where a particular qualification is required for election to the office, and
 - (e) to be signed by 2 members of the Synod, other than the nominee, as nominators, and
 - (f) to contain a certification from at least one of the nominators that –
 - (i) the nominee has consented to the nomination (*it is sufficient grounds for one of the nominators to certify that a retiring person has consented to the nomination if, in the Schedule of Elections Required, the willingness of the person to be nominated is indicated with an asterisk (*) next to his or her name*), and
 - (ii) if the nomination is for an office on a school council, the nominee, if elected, is willing to sign the Statement of personal faith and support for the Christian ethos of the organisation set out in Part A of the Appendix to the Diocesan Policy Statement on Education and will do so before attending any meeting of the council (*a copy of the [Statement of personal faith](#), as amended, can be found on the Secretariat's website at www.sds.asn.au under For Synod & Standing Committee then Reports & Resources*), and
 - (g) to contain an address for acknowledgement of the nomination.
- 3.5 A nomination which does not comply with rule 3.2(2) is invalid except that an error in the specified address or occupation of the nominee does not of itself invalidate a nomination.
- 3.6 A nomination form is contained in item 7 although any document which complies with rule 3.2(2) is in order.
- 3.7 Nominations are to be delivered to - "The Secretaries of Synod, PO Box Q190, QVB Post Office, SYDNEY, NSW 1230" and endorsed "Nominations", by the time referred to in paragraph 3.3.

Invitation to submit precis

- 3.8 A precis of a nominee in an election may be delivered to the Secretaries **no later than 5.00 pm on Monday 29 August 2011**.
- 3.9 Under rule 3.3(1) of the Schedule to the Synod Elections Ordinance 2000 a précis of a nominee is –
- (a) to be not more than 35 words in length, and
 - (b) to be signed by the nominee.
- 3.10 A form of précis is contained in item 8 although any document which complies with rule 3.3(1) is in order.

Time for ballots

- 3.11 Apart from the Standing Committee postal ballot (see paragraphs 4.6 and 4.7), the other ballots will take place on the first and second days of the Synod session, Monday 10 and Tuesday 11 October, at the Synod meeting place.

4. Standing Committee elections

- 4.1 Under the Standing Committee Ordinance 1897 –
- (a) 4 Qualified Ministers and 8 Qualified Lay Persons *are to be elected by the whole Synod in a postal ballot before the Synod session* (2 elections by the whole Synod).
 - (b) 2 Qualified Ministers and 4 Qualified Lay Persons from each Region *are to be elected by Regional Electors at the Synod session* (10 elections by segments of the Synod).
- 4.2 A “Qualified Minister” is a person in holy orders who is a member of the Synod and is not an ex-officio member of the Standing Committee. A Regional Bishop, for example, is already a member of the Standing Committee and may not be nominated as a Qualified Minister.
- 4.3 A “Qualified Lay Person” is a lay person who is a member of the Synod.
- 4.4 For the purposes of the elections of people from regions, the term “Regional Electors” means –
- (a) the Regional Bishop and Regional Archdeacon, and
 - (b) each Qualified Minister licensed to a parochial unit in the Region, and
 - (c) each Qualified Lay Person who is a member of the Synod as a representative of a parochial unit in the Region, and
 - (d) each other member of the Synod who resides in the Region and is not a Regional Elector for another Region.
- 4.5 A person may be nominated for the Standing Committee twice - for election by the whole Synod and for election by Regional Electors.
- 4.6 The nominators/seconders of persons for the Standing Committee elections by the whole Synod should ensure that personal precis are lodged for their nominees by **5:00 pm on Monday 29 August 2011** when nominations close. See item 8 for the Precis form. Please photocopy the form if you have more than 1 nomination. Note that the nominee must sign the precis form.
- 4.7 If the number of nominees in a Standing Committee election by the whole Synod exceeds the number of positions, a postal ballot is required to be held before the Synod session. Such ballot papers will be posted to Synod members on or about Friday 2 September 2011. Members will be invited to complete and send their ballot papers to the Returning Officer **by 5:00 pm on Monday 12 September 2011** when the ballot closes and counting will start. A quick result is needed so that Synod members can be informed of the results in the mailing to be sent on or about 22 September 2011.

5. Regional council elections

- 5.1 Clause 4 of the Regions Ordinance 1995 provides for the “Regional Electors” of a Region to elect –
- (a) 1 lay person from each area deanery in the Region and a further 4 from any area deanery in the Region, and
 - (b) 1 Minister from each area deanery in the Region and a further 2 from any area deanery in the Region.
- 5.2 There will be 2 elections for each Region: 1 for clergy and 1 for lay. The persons with the highest numbers of votes will be declared elected, taking account of the requirement that there must be at least 1 Minister and 1 lay person from each area deanery in the Region.
- 5.3 In the Regional Council elections, “Regional Electors” means –
- (a) the Regional Bishop and the Regional Archdeacon, and
 - (b) each Minister licensed to a parochial unit in the Region and who is a member of the Synod, and
 - (c) each person who is a member of the Synod as a representative of a parochial unit in that Region, and
 - (d) each other person who resides in that Region and is a member of the Synod but is not a Regional Elector of another Region.
- 5.4 Also in the Regional Council elections, a “Minister” is a person in holy orders, and a person is from an area deanery if –
- (a) in the case of a lay person, that person is a parishioner of a church in that area deanery, and
 - (b) in the case of a Minister, that person is licensed to a parochial unit in that area deanery.
- 5.5 Therefore ministers and assistant ministers of parochial units may be nominated, but other clergy may or may not qualify for nomination, depending on their licences.
