#### 6.9 Review of the procedures for a vote by Houses

Synod -

- (a) asks the Standing Committee to consider the matter of a biblical basis for the procedure of voting by houses,
- (b) asks the Standing Committee to give consideration to the possibility of amending the procedures of the Synod in such a way as to ensure that a criteria is applied relating the motion to be voted upon to the specific roles of clergy and laity prior to the division by houses, and
- (c) requests that Standing Committee bring to the next session of Synod appropriate ordinances, motions, or other such items as would be required for Synod to amend its procedures accordingly.

#### 6.10 Review of the procedures requiring eight persons to stand

Synod -

- (a) asks the Standing Committee to consider the procedures of the Synod which require eight persons to stand at various points in order for certain procedures to be undertaken, and give specific consideration to the number of persons required,
- (b) asks the Standing Committee, in view of the increasing size of the Synod, to give consideration to the possibility of increasing the number of persons required to stand for such procedures, in such a way as to balance the efficiency of the procedures of Synod with the need to ensure members of Synod are given due opportunity to have input into all matters, and
- (c) requests that Standing Committee bring to the next session of Synod appropriate ordinances, motions, or other such items as would be required for Synod to amend its procedures accordingly.
