Proposal to Change the Parish of Artarmon to a Provisional Parish

(A Report from the North Sydney Regional Council)

Initiation of Proposal

1. A proposal was made to the Archbishop by the Minister and Churchwardens of St Basil's Artarmon under Clause 4 (1)(c) of the Parishes Ordinance 1974.

Details of Meeting

2. A meeting of North Sydney Regional Council was held on 3 March 1998 to consider the proposal under clause 5 of the Ordinance.

3. North Sydney Regional Council certified that all procedural requirements under clauses 4 and 6 have been complied with and noted that no objections had been received.

Proposal

4. The proposal is to change the parish to a provisional parish.

5. The parish has been unable to meet the local revenue threshold in the years 1995, 1996 and 1997. The parish could not identify any factors which would reverse this situation in the short term and so the Minister and Churchwardens made the proposal in this report. There are no arrears of assessments.

Parish Information

6. There are some 5,100 persons claiming adherence to the Anglican Church of Australia in the Parish and this figure is diminishing. There has been a very strong change in the social composition of the population over the last twenty-five years so that (especially in the residential area near the church) many people are now of Asian origin especially Chinese, Japanese, Korean and other non-English speaking backgrounds.

7. St Basil's Artarmon has traditionally offered a liturgical style of worship in the 'central-church' stream of Anglicanism. It is felt that some of these services should continue as, increasingly, it provides an important niche ministry.

8. The number of regular worshippers began to decline steeply in the late 1960's. Numbers then plateaued and for the last 30 years, there have been about 40-50 attenders at Sunday services each week. A new ministry began in 1997 and many new initiatives have been introduced.

9. The Parish is hoping to use the services of an experienced consultant (e.g. AYED) to assist it in forward planning and developing a new vision for growth.
