# **Camden Variation of Trusts Ordinance 2001**

No 49, 2001

## Long Title

An Ordinance to vary the trusts of the land known as St John's church site, Menangle Road, Camden.

### **Preamble**

- A. The Archbishop of Sydney is the registered proprietor of Lot 1 in Deposited Plan 1024949 known as St John's church site, Menangle Road, Camden (the "Land").
- B. By deed of Feoffment dated 8 May 1841 the Land is held upon trust for the erection thereon of a church or chapel for the performance of divine worship according to the rights of the United Church of England and Ireland as it is now by law established and also for the erection of a residence for a clergyman in Holy Orders and for a Burial Ground according to the use of the said United Church or for all or any of the said objects as the Archbishop of Sydney shall from time to time determine.
- C. By reason of circumstances which have arisen after the creation of trusts on which the Land is held it is inexpedient to carry out or observe those trusts and it is expedient to vary those trusts in the manner set out in this Ordinance.

The Standing Committee of the Synod of the Diocese of Sydney Ordains as follows.

### 1. Name

This Ordinance is the Camden Variation of Trusts Ordinance 2001.

### 2. Declarations

By reason of circumstances which have arisen after the creation of trusts on which the Land is held it is inexpedient to carry out or observe those trusts or to deal with or apply the Land for the same or like purposes as those trusts and it is expedient to vary those trusts in the manner set out in this Ordinance.

### New Trusts

The Land is held upon trust for the purposes of the parish of Camden.
