Picton (ACPT Client Fund 0411) Variation of Trusts Ordinance 2021

No 55, 2021

Long Title

An Ordinance to vary the trusts of certain funds arising from the Estate of the Late Doris Alice Jean Cracknell.

Preamble

- A. The Anglican Church Property Trust Diocese of Sydney (the **ACPT**) is the trustee of ACPT Client Fund 0411 (the **Fund**) arising from the Estate of the Late Doris Alice Jean Cracknell.
- B. The ACPT is permitted to access and apply the income of the Fund for the care and maintenance of the church grounds and cemetery of the parish of Picton by clause 5(b) of the Will of Doris Cracknell.
- C. By reason of circumstances which have arisen after the creation of the trusts on which the Fund is held, it is inexpedient to carry out and observe those trusts and it is expedient to vary those trusts in the manner set out in this Ordinance.

The Standing Committee of the Synod of the Diocese of Sydney Ordains as follows.

1. Name

This Ordinance is the Picton (ACPT Client Fund 0411) Variation of Trusts Ordinance 2021.

2. Declarations

By reason of circumstances which have arisen after the creation of the trusts on which the Fund is held, it is inexpedient to carry out and observe those trusts and it is expedient to vary those trusts in the manner set out in clause 3.

3. Variation of Trusts

The trusts of the Fund are varied to the extent necessary to permit the payment in clause 4.

4. Application

The ACPT is authorised to apply the capital and income of the Fund for such purposes relating to the repair of the roof of the building of St Mark's Church Picton as may be determined from time to time by resolution of the Parish Council of the Parish of Picton.
