An Ordinance to authorise the leasing of certain lands situated at Ryde in the County of Cumberiand and to provide for the application of the rent income and profits thereot.

Wheneas by virtue of an Indenture of Conveyanco bearing dato the eightlo day of May one thousand eight hundred and thirtynine made botween James Devlin and Susanna Dovlin of the firsti part Thomas Small and Priscilla Small of the second part and the Bishop of Australia of the third part registered number 501 Book $P$ tho innd and horeditaments desoribed in the first schedule hereto were (inter alin) assured unto and to the use of the Bishop of Australia and his sugcessors Bishops of Australia for ever subject to the amunl guit ront payable to the Crown and to the other rights of the Crown. And wheneas the said land described in the first schedule hereto has been held since the execution of the said recited Indenture of Convegance dron thers as a site for a Rectory in connection with the Parish of St. Anne's Ryde in the State of New South Wales. And wheneas by another Indenture of Convoynnce boaring date the eighth day of May one thousand oight hundred and thirty-nine made betwaen James Devin and Susanna. Devlin of tiec first part Thomes Small and Priscilla Small of the second part and the Bishop of Australia of the third part registered number 35 B Book $\mathbf{P}$ the f aid and hereditaments desoribed in the second schedule hereto foere assured unto and to the use of the Bishop of Australia and his successors Bishops of Australin for over subject to the annuin quit rent payable to the Crown and to the other rights of the Crown. And whereas the said land described in the second schedule hereto is held in trust for the site of a selool house naster's residence and appurtenanees in connection with the Church of England and Ireland sabpet to the control and supervision of the Bishop of the Diocese for the time being jand also to the rules and regulations of the Denominational Sohool Board. And wemereas a sufficient area of land has been provided within the said parish for the use and purpose of a Rectory and sehool house and the said lands are at present and have for some time past been unused and unproductive and the Church of England in the said Parish is being deprived of the revenue whioh should be dorivable from the same by reason of the fact that no power of leasing the said lands is possessed by the Tristce theroof. The Smod of the Diocebe of

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Srusar in pussume of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Constitutions for the minagement and good government of the Church of England within the State of New South Wales and of all powers vosted in tho said Synod by the Sydney Bishopric and Church Property Act 1887 and the Charch of England Property Aot of 1889 ordains dedares rules directs and appoints as follows:-

1. By reason of circumstnuers which have occurred since the erention of the said recited l'rusts it has become inexpedient to oarry out or observo the partioular purposo or purposes to whiah the said lands desoribed in the first and second schedules hereto are by the said Trusts respectively devoted and it has becomo expedient to lot the said lands on buildiug or occupation lenses for the purpose of obtaining incutue therefrom to be employed in furtherance or aid of the trusts attached to the same or of such substituted purposes as aro horeinafter contained and sot forth.
2. The said lands or any portion or portions thereof may at any time herenfter and from time to time be demised or leased freed from the trusts aforesaid upon building or occupation leases or for such other suitable purposo or purposes as the Trustee thoredof may detormine with power for the said Trustee to lay out and dedicite roads or hanes upphad through the said hads or aily part thereot. Piovined that the terms of any such lense or leases shall not exceed fifty years to talke offect in possession at such rent or rents fixed varying or progressive and upon and subject to such terais covenants and conditions as the said Irustee nay deem expedient but so ns there be reserved in avery such lease or leases the best rent or rents fixed varying or progressive that can reasonably be obtained for the same having regard to the nature of the covenants entered into by the lessee withour taking any fine or premitum for the making thereof and so as there be contained in evary such lease a covenant on the part of every lessed his exeentors administrators and assigns that he and they shall not use or cansa or permit to be used the denised premises of any part or parts thereof for the purpose of carrying on the trade or business of a publican distiller brawer or selley of wines ales beers or spirituous liquors

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or arty dangerous noxious or offensive trade whatsoever and also that every and any such lessee his executors ndministrators or assigus shall not use or cause or permit to be used the demised premises for Sunday trade in any form or Suuday public entertainment and every such lease shall contain a condition for re-entry by the lessor or lessors in the event of defnult being made in payment of ront by the lessee or lessees at the times and in manner provided by such lease or in the event of the breach non-performance or non-observance of any of the covenants and conditions therein contained and so as the lessee or lessees do execute a counterpart of every such lease and do covenant for payment of the rent thereby reserved.
3. The rent profits and income payable undor or derivable from niny such lease or leases as aforesaid shall be held by the said Trustee after payment thereout of the expenses of and incidental to this Ordinance and any leaso or leases of the said landa or portions thereof and the formation of any roads or lanes on the said lands upon rnust to apply the same in or towards the purposes next hereinafter mentioned that is to say as to the rent profits and income derived from the land described in the first, schicdule hereto upon rrust to apply the same in or towards ropairing and maintaining in repair or robuilding the Rectory in connection with the said Parish or the ontbuildings and fences used with the same And as to any portion of such rent profits and incone which shinll not in the opinion of the Trustee be required for such piurposes upon truse to apply such portion for or townds the ineome or stipend of the Rector in elatge of the said Parish And as to the rent profis and income deriyed from the land deseribed in the second echednle hereto upon moder to npply the same in the first place for or toivards the maintenance of a Parochial School (if any) in the said Parisl and should there be mo suoh sohool then UPON untist to apply the same for or towards the income or stipend of the Rector of the said Parish or oron truet to apply all or any of the said rents profits and income for such othar purposes as the Synod slall lierealter from time to time dotermine.
4. This Ordinance shall be styled aud cited as the "St. Aline's Ryde Land Leasing Ordinanite 1910."

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## FIRST SOHEDULE.

Ale that piece or parcel of land situato lying and being in the Parish of Hunter's Hill in the County of Cumberland State of New South Wales be the hereinafter montioned several dimensions a little more or less comarancing at a poins at the interseation of the south-onst building line of Dovlin Street with the south-west building line of Parkes Street and bouaded thence on the northenst by Parkes Street aforesaid bearing one hundred and twentytwo degrees one minute one hundred and forty-eight feet oight and one half inches thence on the south-oast by a line bearing two hundred and eleven degrees twenty riinutes fifty feet thence again on the north-east by a line bearing one hundred and twenty-two degrees one minute two hundred feet to Church Street thence agnin on the south-enst by the said Church Street bearing two hundred and oloven degrees twenty minutes one hundred and ter feet thence on the south-west by a line bearing three hundred and two degrees one minute three hundred and thirty-nine feet and one half inch to Devlin Street and thence on the north-west by the said Devini Street bearing twenty-seven degrees fifty-three minutes ono ' hundred and sixty feet five inohes to the point of commencement and containing in aren one arre and five and one quarter perches.

Ady many pieco or parcel of land situato lying and being in the Marish of Huntor's Hill in the County of Cumberland State of New South Wales be the hereinafter mentioned several dimensions a little more or less commenolina at a point at the intersection of the south-east building line of Belmore Street with the north-east building line of Glebe Street and bounded thence on the south-west by Glebeg Street afoicsaid bearing ninety-four degrees forty-eight minites one hundred and seventy-three feet three and one half incles thence on the south-east by a lina bearing four degrees forty-eight minutes eighty-one foet eight and one quarter fuches thence again on the south-west by a line bearing ninetyfour degrees forty-sight minutes one humdred and thirty-two feet five and one half inches to a lane thence ngait on the south-enst by the said lane bearing thirty-six degrees twenty-three mirntes oṇo hundred and forty-seven feet one and one quarter inches

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thence on the north-east by a line bearing two hundred and eightsfour degrees threo minutes one hundred and seventy-nine feet ten and one half inches to Belmore Street aforesaid and thence on the north-west by Belmore Street aforesaid by lines bearing two hundred and oleven degrees forty-seven minutes seventy-three feet ono and threc-quarter inches and two hundred and thirty dogrees one minute two hundred and forty-two feet four and ono half incles to the point of commencement and containing in area three roods twenty-two and one hailf perches.
