

## Wollongong Regional Council Annual Report for 2008

(A report from the Wollongong Regional Council.)

### Introduction

1. Wollongong Regional Council normally meets 5 times a year on the evening of the second Tuesday of the month in Wollongong with each meeting being preceded by a meal. In 2008 the council met in February, April, June, September and November with an additional meeting in July for grant allocations. The Executive committee also meets five times a year to consider matters delegated to it and to plan agendas for the regular Council meetings.

3. During 2008 Rev Stefan Bull and Mr Roger Summerill resigned from the Council. Rev Rob Copland, Mrs Michelle Farrell, Rev Richard Mills and Ms Vivienne Young were appointed to Council.

### Ministry Strategies

4. For 2008 it was determined to focus attention on developing church planting in more difficult areas of the Region. This was with a view to funding new church plants in 2009.

5. For distribution in 2009 we approved grants totalling \$442,500.

6. The emphasis of these grants was Church Planting, Youth and Children's ministry and Indigenous ministry.

7. The Regional Council also granted \$150 each to students connected to the region who are in full time theological training at Moore College, Youthworks College, and SMBC.
