- (c) notwithstanding paragraph (a), agrees to commence the order of business for Monday 16 September 2024 with the following two items

- (ii) The President, or a person appointed by him, is to read a passage from the Bible and apply it, and suspends so many of the Standing Orders as would prevent these arrangements.

and agrees -

- (h) to deal with its business in accordance with the Timetable for Synod Business, subject to the ultimate discretion of the President,
- that the mover and seconder of the motion at M3 (Sadleir: Classification as a Parish) may combine for a joint presentation with visuals for up to 15 minutes including prayer, on Monday 16 September (evening session, from 7.00 pm),
- that the mover and seconder of the motion at M4 (Sussex Inlet: Classification as a Parish) may combine for a joint presentation with visuals for up to 15 minutes including prayer, on Monday 23 September (afternoon session, immediately prior to the dinner break),
- (k) that Dr Emma Penzo, a member of the Central Diocesan Structures Review Committee who is not a member of the Synod, may attend and speak to any motion moved at the session in connection with the review of the central organisational structures of the Diocese, if called on to do so, but not vote on any such motion,
- to a one-page flyer, in connection with the presentation mentioned in paragraph (f), being made available in the foyer of the Synod venue following the presentation for collection by members, and
- (m) to reserve the evening of Wednesday 18 September for the conclusion of debate on any matters commenced but not yet concluded earlier in the session,

and suspends so many of the Standing Orders as would prevent these arrangements.

 - (ii) following the speech of the mover, a 'set piece debate' will be held in the order shown, with speeches up to the duration shown
 - (A) M11 The Rev Dr Mark Thompson (in favour) 10 minutes,
 - (B) M11 The Rev Dr Andrew Katay (against) 10 minutes,
 - (C) Debate to proceed on M11 5 minutes per speech,
 - (D) the speakers at (A) and (B) each be given the right of reply on M11 5 minutes each,
 - (E) M11 will be put to a secret ballot by houses,

- (F) M12 Dean Sandy Grant (in favour) 10 minutes,
- (G) M12 The Rev Dr Michael Jensen (against) 10 minutes,
- (H) Debate to proceed on M12 5 minutes per speech,
- (I) the speakers at (F) and (G) each be given the right of reply on M12 3 minutes each,
- (J) M12 will be put to a secret ballot by houses,
- (K) M13 Dr Laurie Scandrett (in favour) 10 minutes,
- (L) M13 The Rev Tim Bowden (against) 10 minutes,
- (M) Debate to proceed on M13 5 minutes per speech,
- (N) the speakers at (K) and (L) each be given the right of reply on M13 3 minutes each, and
- (O) M13 will be put to a secret ballot by houses,
- (iii) a secret ballot by houses will be taken on each of the motions, with each vote taken at the end of the debate on the corresponding motion,
- (iv) debate on the subsequent motions may nonetheless proceed before the result of the ballot on the prior motion is known, and
- (v) if the President announces that M11 has not been carried, Synod grants the mover leave to withdraw M12 and M13 immediately,
- (c) schedule consideration of the proposed Diocesan Governance Policy for a subsequent day of the session,
- (d) begin such consideration with a motion, without a seconder's speech, that the proposed Diocesan Governance Policy in a form which reflects the decisions made by the Synod regarding Appendix 3 be approved in principle,
- (e) request the Diocesan Secretary to prepare and circulate electronically to the Synod a revised form of the Diocesan Governance Policy reflecting the outcome of Synod's consideration of motions M11 - M13, and
- (f) consider the motion at M14 immediately following the passing of the Policy,

and suspends so many of the Standing Orders as would prevent these arrangements.

(3) Divisions 2 and 3 of this Part 8A do not apply to a person who is a member of Synod under subclause 50BA(1).', and

(d) in the Dictionary substitute the definition of 'Indigenous Person' with the following –

"Indigenous Person" means a person who -

- (a) is of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent, and
- (b) identifies as an Aboriginal Person or Torres Strait Islander, and
- (c) is accepted as such by the community in which they live or formerly lived.""

CC M27 NSW Poker Machine Reform

- (a) the NSW Budget 2024-25 expects "increased gaming machine activity" and has revised gambling tax revenue estimates much higher over the forward estimates, with taxation revenue on hotel gaming devices, principally poker machines, expected to grow fastest of all at 8% p.a., while gambling tax revenue is already expected to be \$3.5 billion in 2023-24 alone, and
- (b) a recent survey from Wesley Mission found 30% of respondents know someone who has experienced harm through poker machine use. Such research and forward estimates indicate that recent modest harm minimisation steps by the Government have made negligible difference to the deleterious impact of poker machine gambling on public health and welfare in NSW,

requests the Archbishop, along with all concerned Anglican church members, to write to the Premier of NSW calling for prompt implementation of a universal cashless gaming card with mandatory harm reduction measures, taking account of the learnings from of the trial currently underway.

 - (i) that the New South Wales Education Department requires each parish SRE Coordinator to declare in writing that they will immediately notify the Department of Education if they receive advice from the Office of the Children's Guardian (OCG) that one of our SRE teachers' or helpers' Working With Children Check (WWCC) clearance expires, has been closed or becomes barred from working with children, and
 - (ii) there is a reasonable expectation that the OCG will communicate information about the WWCC clearance status of any SRE teach or helper via the two Contacts supplied by the parish to the OCG, which may or may not include the parish SRE Coordinator, and
- (d) requests the Youthworks SRE Office to ensure that each Rector makes a written commitment when appointing his parish SRE Coordinator that he will ensure that
 - (i) all persons who answer the parish phone during business hours can recognise names of SRE teachers and helpers, and
 - (ii) as and when any communication from the OCG is received by the parish concerning the WWCC clearance status of any SRE teacher or helper, he (or, in his absence, any person answering the parish phone) will immediately
 - (A) notify all schools at which that SRE teacher or helper is authorised, on behalf of the SRE Coordinator, and
 - (B) confirm to the SRE Coordinator that such notification has been made.

CC M30 Spirit-led evolution of the pathway to ordination of women

Synod -

- (a) gives thanks to God for healing across the worldwide Anglican Communion, and specifically across the Anglican Church of Australia as passionately-held differences on biblical interpretation held in the 1980s have transitioned to the recognition of 'God-given diversity' as described in the Jerusalem Declaration,
- (b) recognises that national Anglican churches within GAFCON ordain women as priests, in common with many national Anglican churches identified as aligned with the See of Canterbury,
- (c) acknowledges that, forty years or more ago, difference in biblical interpretation between certain Australia Dioceses were marked, with Sydney Synod receiving multiple assessments by the Doctrine Commission including (8/87; 1988) 'a woman may not take the responsibility for the teaching of the faith in the family congregation',
- (d) notes that, where once there was declared impaired fellowship with one Diocese which pursued women's ordination in the absence of national consensus,
- (e) now, as the Archbishop has advised Synod (2023), such impaired fellowship with any Diocese is no longer recognised,
- (f) affirms the view (Bishop Glenn Davies, 2016) that each member's assessment of women's ordination to the presbyterate is the only basis for any further decision making, with diversity of opinion also recognised, and
- (g) in considering such ordination, gives thanks to God for the ministry of women variously appointed bishops, priests and deacons across the Anglican Church of Australia and prays for continuing outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon all women who are ordained.

CC M31 Pastoral care of women called to the priesthood

Synod -

- (a) acknowledges that since the 1980's, some individual women from within this Diocese experiencing a call to the priesthood have sought to test whether such a call is through the Holy Spirit by praying and consulting with clergy from other Anglican dioceses in Australia,
- (b) likewise acknowledges that exclusion of women from teaching and from exercising authority over men was seen early on to epitomize submission to biblical authority and thus contribute to the character of the Diocese. In Synod the role of secular feminism in motivating women toward ordination was described,
- (c) is now able to advise women experiencing a call to ordination that the principles and practice in this Diocese concerning women as priests is transitioning from comprehensive prohibitions once in practice, as shown by recognition of the authority that women priests and bishops variously exercise in General Synod and the Archbishop of Perth being authorized to preach in Sydney in 2023,
- (d) gives thanks to God concerning women clergy in this Diocese, for the wide teaching ministries exercised through publication and discharge parochial responsibilities in a manner indistinguishable from that of rector,
- (e) likewise gives thanks for wives and mothers of Sydney clergy who have been ordained as priests in other Dioceses, and

(f) therefore urges women from our Diocese who experience a call to priesthood to consider their future here rather than elsewhere and to discuss their situation with, among others, their rector and their regional bishop, knowing that through the same Spirit, circumstances in this Diocese are in transition.

- (a) gives thanks to the Lord for the faithful Anglican ministry efforts of both laity and clergy in the Diocese of Sydney since 1788, the crucial work of Moore Theological College, Anglicare, Youthworks, diocesan schools and other ministry organisations in supporting the ministry of the Diocese's churches, the visionary and theological leadership of Archbishops and other leaders, past and present, and the property and financial resources which facilitate the ministry of the Word,
- (b) laments the decline in attendance throughout the Diocese as a whole over the last decade, and
- (c) therefore requests the Standing Committee to establish a taskforce which is to report to the 2025 session of Synod to answer and address these matters
 - (i) What will be the probable operational, clergy recruitment and training, property and financial consequences of fellowshipping and connecting as a Diocese of approximately 270 parishes, if the rate of church attendance decline, identified in the Attendance Patterns Review Committee's report, continues for another decade?
 - (ii) recommended contingency plans, to address the probable operational consequences identified in paragraph (a), and
 - (iii) recommended strategic reallocation of Diocesan financial, property and human resources so that ministry to youth receives a disproportionally greater allocation, compared to other ministries than is currently the case, even if that necessarily requires a reduced allocation to other important ministries.
